Parish Council update:

At the meeting held on 23 March in the Village Hall the PC discussed, among other things:

<u>Defibrillators</u> – Another two are planned, one for Highfield Farm and another in WWE. All the defibrillators are suitable for use on adults and children, the original two having now been upgraded for this purpose. Keep an eye out for notice of more training sessions, although using them is fairly self-explanatory.* *see locations further on in Newsletter*

<u>FRC</u> – reported that they had donated £8,294 towards the new playground equipment on the Green. <u>Tennis Courts</u> – have now had moss and leaves cleared and are ready for use.

<u>Crime</u> – there has been a report of theft from a local farm but otherwise all crime in the area is vehicle related with notice of two vehicle thefts; theft of catalytic converters is also something to be aware of. <u>Potholes</u> – conversations have been had with Highways about the condition of local roads, however, the PC are led to believe that pot holes are definitely NOT top of their list just now, however, residents should continue to report these in order that the danger to motorists, cyclists and others, caused by damage to road surfaces and road edges, should be recognised.

<u>Station Path</u> – the contract for extending the path from the station at the village end has been awarded and the contractor is awaiting suitable conditions to carry out the work.

<u>Electric vehicle charging points</u> – currently this has stalled and our grant application was not upheld. <u>Village Green</u> – Cutting the village green is to continue on a regular basis, however, an area near the pond will be left natural to attract wildlife and wild flowers. A councillor is liaising with an organisation to promote our environmental interests.

It was announced at the end of the meeting that Councillor Julia Camp will not be standing for re-election on 4^{th} May. She was thanked for her long service.

District and Parish Council elections

<u>Voter ID:</u> At the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023 <u>voters will be required to show photo ID at polling stations</u>. This can be a passport, driving licence or another acceptable ID showing your photo. If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID you can apply for a free voter ID, known as a Voter Authority Certificate, at <u>www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate</u>. Application forms can also be obtained from EHC on 01279 655261 (Electoral Services Team). The deadline to apply for elections on 4 May 2023 is Tuesday 25 April 2023.

Dog Poo increase in the Village

Residents have recently noticed an increase in dog poo being left on pavements and public grassed areas, especially around Fanshaws Lane. I'm sure everyone will agree that what is particularly annoying is when residents, and their children, step in the mess and take it into the house, only for a lengthy clean-up to begin.

Please will anyone allowing their dog to do its business in the village make sure that it's bagged and taken home or disposed of in one of the village dog poo bins provided (including the dedicated one in Fanshaws Lane). Those not so responsible dog owners are respectfully reminded that it is an offence to allow your dog to defecate in our village without picking it up.

<u>Brickendon Brook:</u> although not in the Parish of Brickendon Liberty, the condition of the brook at the end of Brickendon Lane has been of concern to residents for many years. Repairs have never fully solved the flooding problem, which earlier this year completely obstructed passage for some smaller vehicles and resulted in some drivers getting stuck in the water. However, a resident, after getting passed around by various agencies including Hertfordshire CC, took it upon himself to contact local councillors and our MP Julie Marson - who allocated it a case reference. The retaining wall has now been repaired (we are not sure by whom) and the bed of the brook has been dredged by A.T. Bone – to whom we owe our thanks – with the brook flowing freely in the recent heavy rains.
