Fete Report: The weather was good and this year's fete was a great occasion and all round success thanks to the hard work put in by the fete committee and their many helpers. A popular addition was the Birds of Prey display which, together with all the usual games and attractions, made for a wonderful end of summer occasion. Winners of prizes have all been contacted and we now know that a profit of approximately £2,800 was made, this will finance various upcoming parish events as well as allowing us to make a donation to each of our three selected charities; **Herts Cadets, Guide Dogs and Hertford Jedidiha Food Bank.**

Parish Council meeting 28 September: (Minutes of all PC meetings are on the Brickendon

Liberty website): It was good that several residents attended this meeting, together with both our Hertfordshire County Councillor and our East Herts District Councillor. It was reported by the District Councillor that East Herts are working on climate change and budget issues which may affect the level of services. Work is also going on with HCC on flooding issues and refuse collection. The PC clerk reported that there has recently been a low level of crime in the area, with none reported during August, and that she does access regular updates. Thanks were extended to two local residents who have taken it upon themselves to clean some of our village signs which had become almost unreadable. A discussion took place on purchasing a Beacon in time for the D-Day celebrations in June 2024; this was agreed in principle with further investigation to take place.

Oak Processionary Moth (OPM)

Villagers will have seen that part of the play area on the Green was cordoned off at the beginning of August. This was due to the discovery of three Oak Processionary Moth (OPM) nests in the commemorative oak trees. These pesky critters were unintentionally introduced to the UK in 2005 via the importation of wood and are now found across the southeast – including Hertfordshire. They are not an indigenous species but due to our changing climate and local weather conditions they are happily breeding and spreading. They are a pest for two main reasons.

- 1) The caterpillars feed on the leaves of oak trees causing stress to the tree and making them more susceptible to other pests, disease and drought.
- 2) The older caterpillars have hundreds of tiny hairs which can cause itching skin rashes, eye irritations, sore throats, breathing difficulties and, rarely, allergic reactions in people and animals.

Because of the spread and threat to humans, animals and plants, OPM are subject to a government monitoring scheme. This means that any sightings should be reported to the Forestry Commission. The recent nests on the Village Green were reported to the Parish Council who acted swiftly to cordon off the area, report their presence and arrange removal. It is important for villagers to be aware that if you see an OPM nest or cluster of caterpillars, please:

- do not touch or approach OPM nests or caterpillars;
- do not let children or animals touch or approach nests or caterpillars;
- do not try removing nests or caterpillars yourself; and
- see a pharmacist for relief from skin or eye irritations after suspected OPM contact; or
- call NHS111 or see a doctor if you think you or someone in your care has had a serious allergic reaction tell the doctor you suspect OPM contact.

Fly Tipping and Litter

Together we can keep Brickendon tidy

We've all seen it; discarded cans, fast food wrappers, drinks bottles, piles of rubble, tyres and plant pots littering our country lanes, the Village Green, footpaths and roadside hedges and verges. This is fly tipping and litter and data collected by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirms that over the last few years it's got worse. Fly-tipping is defined as the 'illegal deposit of any waste onto land that does not have a licence to accept it'. Litter is defined as rubbish such as paper, cans, and bottles discarded in an incorrect place, often in an open or public space.

It is unfortunate that as a village in a rural area we suffer from both fly tipping and litter and the consequences are often unsightly, costly to clear up and damaging to the environment. This dumping of waste materials can also be hazardous to people and animals. Fly tipping is illegal. If you see it in action, call the police on 999 and report it as a crime in progress. Across Hertfordshire, the District and Borough Councils work in partnership with the County Council to tackle fly tipping and they have excellent information and advice on reporting.

We are fortunate that we have a plethora of litter bins on the Green and three dog waste bins, but this doesn't stop litter on the Green (some of which is caused by animals foraging in the bins!) and in the surrounding area. For those of you who take part in the twice-yearly litter pick, you will have seen the sheer amount and variety of waste items that are collected from our road verges and hedgerows. Helium balloons, crisp packets, glass bottles, gas canisters, cans, road signs, tyres, buckets, bags, boxes, polystyrene, gloves.....the list goes on and on. Villagers, please be vigilant, and report all fly tipping to East Herts Council, whether you saw it in progress or not. www.eastherts.gov.uk/bins-waste-and-recycling/dumped-rubbish-fly-tipping-and-littering

What to include in your fly tipping report:

- exact location
- date and time that you discovered the fly tipping
- details
- and photos of the items.

If you saw the fly tipping happen:

- vehicle's registration number and details
- description of the fly tippers (and photos if possible)
- direction they were travelling
