# Notes from Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 28 March 2024

- A Beacon will be erected on the Green ready to be lit on 6<sup>th</sup> June to commemorate D-Day
- Concern about parking on the road near Bayford station was expressed and noted by the police officers present
- An initiative to erect bird and bat boxes is being pursued by two local young people and will be supported by the Parish Council
- A defibrillator will shortly be installed at Highfield Farm; the installation of another defibrillator at WWE is still under review
- The target for raising funds from parishioners has been reached and the PC are now looking to employ a solicitor to further our application to purchase the village green
- The Litter Pick in March was a massive success and the chair of the PC expressed his thanks to the many parishioners who turned up to help. Another will be held in the Autumn.



 The police officers present at the meeting gave a report on crime in the vicinity of the parish saying crime in Brickendon Liberty is very low. They did however reinforce the need to stay alert, particularly to vehicle crime.

- There are road works planned for the local area and parishioners should remain alert for possible road closures.
- Fencing around the village green has been surveyed and will be repaired as necessary.
- Installation of electric car charging points is still being pursued with assistance from a volunteer parishioner.

### **Fanshaws Room Committee**

At their meeting in February FRC discussed, among other things, plans for an event on the Village Green to celebrate the anniversary of the **D-Day landings in WWII.** This will take place on **8**<sup>th</sup> **June** and will follow the format of last year's Coronation celebration. A marquee has already been ordered and plans are currently in place to book a band and organise drinks and food. We are also planning to take part in the lighting of a beacon on **6**<sup>th</sup> **June** which will be installed on the village green. All residents of Brickendon Liberty are invited to attend both events.

The Hall is available for bookings and Covid restrictions are no longer in place. Residents of the parish are able to benefit from a lower hourly hire rate of £10.

Plans for the Fete and Dog Show on 1<sup>st</sup> September are currently underway. If you can help by manning a stall or running a game, baking a cake or in any other way, please contact a member of the Fete committee.

The next meeting of FRC will be on 18<sup>th</sup> April in the village hall. This will be the AGM and all are welcome.

# A little timely advice from a local business:

There's something magical about gathering around a crackling fire. To make sure your cosy moments are also safe, we've put together a helpful guide to chimney safety and creating the perfect, secure blaze.

Let's start by looking after your chimney. Think of it as the heart of your fireplace. It needs a little TLC to keep things running smoothly. Schedule a visit from a chimney sweep before the winter chill sets in. They'll remove any build up, especially creosote, which is a fire risk. Don't forget the basics, a good chimney cowling keeps out unwanted guests like debris and critters, reducing the chance of blockages. Give your chimney a visual once-over, fixing any wear and tear pronto. Think of an open fire like an open window, you'll soon notice the cold air when your fire isn't lit. This is the reason why many people choose to go for a log burner; you raise your efficiency from 10% to 85%. If you're not using it, it's well worth capping the chimney at the top.

Building the perfect fire is an art, not a science! <u>Choose Dry Wood</u>: Opt for seasoned hardwoods like oak or maple. Dry wood burns cleaner, making less smoke and reducing the risk of creosote build up. <u>Start Small</u>: begin with small, dry kindling before adding bigger logs. It's like giving your fire a warm-up, ensuring a steady burn without a smoky start. <u>Leave Some Ash</u>: A little ash between uses (about an inch) acts as insulation, helping the fire maintain its warmth and radiate heat into your space. <u>Add Detectors</u>: Install carbon monoxide detectors. While it's uncommon, blockages can lead to this odourless gas. Safety first!
