<u>Village Hall (Fanshaws Room)</u>: Big shout out of thanks to **T.J. FIRE & SECURITY** for keeping our village hall fire equipment up-to-date and in safe, working condition. They make an annual visit to check that all is in order so that we can safely use the hall, and rent it out, in the knowledge that we are fire safe – so important in a basically wooden construction of some age.

Damage to Brickendon Chapel fencing: On Saturday 25 May, during the night, a vehicle ploughed into the fencing at the front of the Chapel causing a considerable amount of damage. The fence and concrete post holding up the noticeboard were destroyed and hedges were uprooted. It is believed to have occurred at approximately 12.55am. The vehicle that was involved must have been damaged since various parts have been discovered amongst the debris. It is thought to have been a vehicle of considerable weight, possibly a 4 x 4. The police are aware and would welcome any further information that can be provided.



Brickendon Green Tennis Courts

The Parish Council and Fanshaws Room Management Committee are concerned that the tennis courts are seriously under used and are looking at ideas to rectify this. The cost of maintaining the two courts is high but income is low so at a recent meeting of FRMC thought was given to how this could be rectified, possibly by changing the use of the courts. Various ideas were put forward such as turning them into a 5-aside football pitch, converting them into Paddle Board courts or other ways of redeveloping the land. Fanshaws Room (Management) Committee

This committee was set up many years ago (middle of last century) as a sub-committee of the Parish Council. Its mandate was to oversee the village hall (Fanshaws Room) and other village amenities and to hold social functions that would financially maintain these facilities. Nowadays most of our income comes from the annual fete and hall lettings; FRMC doesn't receive any financial benefit from the precept (aka Council Tax). Happily, we generally raise enough to also hold parish events such as the 2023 Coronation Party and this year's D-Day commemoration BBQ; in addition, we finance the annual Christmas party for the younger children in the parish, including purchasing a gift for each child and we also provide either a Christmas lunch, or a hamper for retired folk in the parish. FRMC makes contributions to other village initiatives including the provision and upkeep of play equipment and benches on the Green.

So, what is the problem you ask ... well, it is simply that we get very little support from folk living in the area and hence FRMC is now down to just 5 long term members, plus a Parish Councillor, and we are running out of ideas. Last year we held a Christmas party that very few residents attended and we don't know where we went wrong ... what do parishioners want? Unless we are able to encourage more residents to attend meetings – fewer than 6 per year – and tell us what the village wants this committee (FRMC) is in danger of folding, there will then be no children's party, no Christmas gifts, and no celebrations on the Green etc.
