Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 27 March – main points of discussion:

- Tim Hoskin (EHDC) spoke about the new litter bin contract and the arrangements for collection in this parish designed to encourage re-cycling but going to a 3 week collection. Households should by now have received a leaflet explaining the changes. He also confirmed that the government will be making a final decision on changes to parish and town councils shortly. There will be elections for local councillors to HCC on 1st May. **Our current representative, Jonathan Kaye, will not be standing again and the PC thanked him for all his hard work on behalf of Brickendon Liberty, he will be missed.**
- Residents of WWE made a request for signs to reduce speeding in the village. Specific locations should go to Jonathan Kaye for referral to the appropriate authority.
- Road faults should be reported to the HCC website: www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/services/highways-roads-and-pavements/report-a-problem/report-a-highway-fault/what-type-of-fault-are-you-reporting.aspx
- A defibrillator has now been installed at Highfield Farm and the PC is planning a training session on how to use it. The PC is still having difficulty finding a site at WWE.
- It was confirmed by the Chair that a one off lump sum to cover the cost of the fencing replacement around the Green in Brickendon has been added into this coming year's Precept.
- Fly tipping is still a concern, particularly in Back Lane. The PC is considering various deterrents. The recommended contact to report fly tipping was given as customer.services@eastherts.
- It was recorded that, whilst no planning application has as yet been submitted, the land upon which BGGC are looking to build three new houses has recently been cleared of its existing vegetation and trees and that this may be in breach of a previous planning condition relating to the two new houses built in 2015/16.
- No crimes were registered in the parish during January or February
- Some further road closures are planned for May that may affect local residents. HCC do publish a map of proposed work on their website which residents can access.

Fanshaws Room Committee

The meeting of FRC on 6 March was held in the Snug at the Farmers Boy and attended by seven resident members. It was reported that work on the vegetation surrounding the tennis courts will be carried out and members of the PC are considering tidying up the area where users park. The Fete Committee have started work on plans for this year's event on **Sunday 7 September (11.30am – 3.30pm)**; this year there will be a greater variety of music and various amusements have already been booked – including, of course, the ever popular Punch & Judy show. More information in the next Newsletter but do remember to put aside items for Bric-a-Brac, the book stall etc. and any help you can give setting up, helping on a stall or clearing up afterwards, will be much appreciated.

Village Green

We are very grateful to the Countryside Management Service volunteers who braved the cold February weather to help villagers give the Green a spruce up. The intrepid band worked tirelessly to clear the scrub and dead and fallen trees along the boundary ditch and from around the benches on the Green. They also cleared scrub, overgrown willow and fallen branches from the pond, made bramble-free access to the benches and enabled better management of the grassed areas. If you would like to get involved in other activities like this in our local area, CMS are actively looking for more Wood Wardens at Broxbourne Woods. They meet on the 3rd Sunday of each month at 10am to carry out conservation and practical tasks around Broxbourne and Bencroft Woods.

Brickendon & Wormley West End History Corner

In 1030, at Montacute in Somerset, a black flint crucifix was found buried in a field owned by Tovi the Proud, one of King Canute's standard bearers. Tovi had an estate at Waltham, in Essex and set out to bring the cross to his hunting lodge in the forest at Waltham. Here Tovi built a small wooden chapel to house the cross. Tovi was succeeded by his son Athelstan who lost Waltham, which was then given by Edward the Confessor to Earl Harold. Harold set about enriching the church of Waltham partly because he had recovered from a serious illness after praying before the cross. One of the eighteen manors bestowed by Earl Harold on Waltham was Brikendune (Brickendon). So the estate became ecclesiastical property and in the 12th century Brickendon became a Liberty ('freedom from geld and toll and the forfeitures of criminals') when Henry II confirmed ownership of the manor to Waltham Abbey. The Chapel was named Holy Cross and St Alban on account of its close connection with the Abbey of Waltham Holy Cross and St Alban, the patron saint of the diocese. The present chapel was built with funds provided by the owner of the field on which it was built, a Mrs Kingsley who lived in Hacketts, and completion of the work was overseen by her daughter, Constance Demain Saunders. It was consecrated on 17 May 1933 by the Right Reverend Bishop Lander. *(with thanks to the late Athene Sanders)*

Wormley West End

The estate of Wormleybury was one of several estates which King Harold endowed and granted to the Canons of Waltham Abbey (Waltham Holy Cross). In 1220 the Canons of Waltham constructed a conduit for carrying water from Wormley to the monastery. Wormleybury house, now divided into flats, has its own Wikipedia page, which is well worth reading.
